#### **Assess Future Needs of Belongings**

- Will it fit in the new space? *Measure furniture* to make sure it will fit in the new space
- Will you need the lawn mower anymore?

## Sort Belongings Into Categories

- Keep
- Maybe (keep and decide later)
- Sell (at auction, estate sale, yard sale)
- Give Away (to family members or friends)
- Donate (to charitable organizations)
- Throw Out (Resist the "maybe I will need it mindset." Consider if it is worth the cost and effort to pack, move, and unpack)

### Helpful Hints/Reminders:

Start early—the process can take a while.

Try taking care of a room/project one at a time.

Give yourself grace in the process. It is emotional, and it takes a lot of energy. Keep the end in mind: The process is painful, but you will feel relief.

### How to Prepare for Listing

- Take furniture down to a minimum
- Clear pathways to walk through the house
- Replace burned out light bulbs using all the same color
- Minimize personal photos throughout the house
- De-clutter closets, kitchen cabinets, countertops, and refrigerator
- Wipe up the stove and clean out the inside
- Ensure windows and ceiling fans are clean
- Straighten up the garage and/or shed
- Clean walls and doors. Touch-up with paint if needed
